All Sin

In his sermon entitled "The Holy Spirit Glorifying Christ," Charles Spurgeon provides a memorable illustration concerning the sufficiency of Christ's atonement:

Luther says that when the devil came to him, he brought him a long sheet containing a list of his sins, or of a great number of them, and Luther said to him, "Is that all?"

"No," said the devil.

"Well, go and fetch some more then." Away went Satan to bring him another long list, as long as your arm.

Luther said, "Is that all?"

"Oh, no!" said the devil, "I have more yet."

"Well, go and bring them all," said Luther. "Fetch them all out, the whole list of them." Then it was a very long black list. I think that I have heard that it would have gone round the world twice. I know that mine would.

Well, what did Luther say when he saw them all? He said, "Write at the bottom of them, 'The blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanses us from all sin!'" (*The Metropolitan Tabernacle Pulpit Sermons*, vol. 50, 526)

It doesn't matter how long your list of sins is or how long your list of sins gets. If we are contrite, penitent Christians who confess our sins (1 John 1:8-10), then Christ's blood can "cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:7). That's good news. No, that's great news. That news is so great that it can buoy us in a world where Covid-19, earthquakes, and brutal regimes frighten and/or kill people.

A couple of those times I ended up regretting that decision. While I didn't get badly dehydrated, I still REALLY wanted some water by the time that we got back.

I am certain that pretty much everyone has been in that situation at some point. Maybe you were mowing your lawn on a hot, humid day and hadn't taken a break for a couple of hours. Perhaps you were playing a sport and really exerting yourself. We all know what it feels like to be thirsty.

Are we this thirsty for the living water that Jesus provides? We frequently place other things in our lives in a position of greater importance than our relationship with God and becoming more like His Son. When we do this, our lives become spiritually dehydrated. What may be the scariest part about this is that, for many of us, the more spiritually dehydrated we become the more difficult it is to even realize it. Before long, if we aren't regularly nourishing our relationship with God, we could find ourselves estranged from Him.

If you plan to exert yourself physically, it is important to hydrate prior to the exertion, during the exertion, and after you have completed whatever task you have in front of you. Our physical health depends on it! Are we doing the same thing to take care of ourselves spiritually? If we aren't consistently taking in the Living Water, we may find our relationship with God and the blessings associated with it completely dried up.
