The Word vs. The World

Only God's Word should be allowed to define what is sinful. God's Word, not the world, declares what is sinful (Rom. 12:1-2). Since God's word is unchanging through time (Ps. 119:89; 1 Pet. 1:23-25), the definition and description of what is sinful never changes. To be sure, people have invented ways of sinning that are not explicitly mentioned in the Bible, but it is often obvious that what is being done runs counter to certain principles established in Scripture.

On various points, our contemporary culture falls right in line with biblical teaching; with respect to other moral matters, our culture does not. There has been a strong push in our society to accept, even celebrate, homosexual marriage (or homosexuality in general) as well as transgenderism (cf. Rom. 1:18-32; 1 Cor. 6:9-11; 1 Tim. 1:8-11; Jude 7). We are also expected to rid our rhetoric of any exclusive claims. Truth is relative, so they say, and those who make absolute truth claims are the real "sinners" (cf. John 17:17).

Without question, our culture wields a powerful influence. Many Christians, often unwittingly, allow the culture to help them construct their moral compass. And with a compromised moral compass in hand, some Christians may be guilty of certain sins for which they will not take responsibility because they no longer view them as sinful. Furthermore, though they may not commit these sins themselves, they unfortunately approve of these sins in the lives of those around them. Indeed, many Christians excuse or overlook certain sins by arguing that the Bible's denunciation of them is culturally based, implying that one's stance toward certain things can ebb and flow with the changing culture.

Kevin DeYoung writes, "Worldliness is what any particular culture does to make sin look normal and righteousness look strange." In various ways, Christians are called to be countercultural (Rom. 13:11-14; 1 Pet. 2:11-12). If we allow culture a seat at the table when it comes to defining sin, it may not be long before we start using culture as means of denying the presence of certain sins in our lives or the lives of others.
