Information and Transformation

If your parents or grandparents raised you in the church, then you spent a fair amount of time in Sunday School or mid-week Bible studies. As a toddler, you were introduced to a variety of biblical stories and biblical characters. As a teenager, you studied books of the Bible, received instruction in what God wanted you to pursue and what He wanted you to avoid, and received answers to questions you were asking about God, the Bible, etc. By that time in your life, you may have even participated in a Bible Bowl or two, and you would have also been the beneficiary of numerous admonitions from the preacher in the pulpit to spend time studying God's Word on your own. If you were like me and chose to attend a Christian university to study the Bible, you would have naturally stood in awe of your professors. They knew so much; you knew so little.

Knowledge is important. We should desire to know as much about the Bible as we possibly can. There's nothing inherently wrong with that. Information—the right information—is important. It's needed. There are things we need to know, but God expects us to grow with what we know. We can go to heaven without knowing the length of Og's bed, the height of Goliath, the number of David's mighty men, or the year that Nebuchadnezzar ransacked Jerusalem, but we can't go to heaven without knowing the Christ. Knowing the Christ speaks of a relationship, and that relationship involves much more than having the right information about Him. Yes, it's about listening to Jesus by means of Scripture and coming to a knowledge of His will for our lives, but it's also about doing what we learn from Him. What we know and believe in our heads must inform our hearts and hands.

Both Jesus and His younger half-brother, James, warn us of the trap of prizing information to the exclusion of transformation. Both emphasize the need not just to **hear** the truth or **know** the truth or even **believe** the truth, but to **do** the truth or **obey** the truth (Matt. 7:24-27; Jas. 1:22-25; 2:14-26; Hebrews 5:9).

Interestingly, we can be just as lost with a head full of knowledge as a head devoid of knowledge. There are atheistic, humanistic professors who know a lot of biblical facts and information, perhaps more than even some of us do, but their knowledge about the Bible won't save them. For one, they don't believe what they know, and two, they are certainly not going to submit to Jesus or put into practice what they know. Let's be sure that we don't confuse hearing, knowing, or believing the truth with doing or obeying the truth.

"If you know these things, blessed are you if you do them."






