## The Trinity Who Is There

A lady by the name of Mamie Adams always went to a branch post office in her town because the postal employees there were friendly. She went there to buy stamps just before Christmas one year, and the lines were particularly long. Someone pointed out that there was no need to wait in line because there was a stamp machine in the lobby. "I know," said Mamie, "but the machine won't ask me about my arthritis."

Some theologians hold to the doctrine of the impassibility of God. This means, in its weaker form, that God cannot suffer; in its stronger form, that God cannot be acted upon at all. Emotionally speaking, He's not much different from that stamp machine in the postal office. He's stoic. He is too transcendent to be affected by what we do or what we suffer.

I would argue that the Trinity (Father, Son, and Spirit) is a divine community that is truly affected by the suffering that we experience. I do not believe that God is impassible, i.e., incapable of feeling. "Is not Ephraim my dear son, the child in whom I delight? Though I often speak against him, I still remember him. Therefore my heart yearns for him; I have great compassion for him," declares the Lord" (Jer. 31:20). That does not sound like a God who remains unaffected by us.

In the pages of Scripture, as the Father, Son, and Spirit have been revealed to us, we find that each person of the Trinity is intimately concerned about us. The persons of the Trinity are described in ways that undergird their concern for us. We shouldn't be surprised to find some overlap in these descriptions; after all, God is one (Deut. 6:4; Jas. 2:19). God the Father is "the God of endurance and encouragement" (Rom. 15:5) and "the God of all comfort" (2 Cor. 1:3). He is our Constant Companion (Heb. 13:5-6) and Burden Bearer (1 Pet. 5:6-7). God the Son is "the Prince of Peace" (Isa. 9:6), a Steadfast Supporter (Matt. 28:20), our "great high priest" (Heb. 4:14-16), and our "advocate" (1 John 2:1). God the Spirit is the Guarantee Giver (2 Cor. 1:21-22; 5:5; Eph. 1:13), our Prayer Partner (Rom. 8:26-27), and a Strength Supplier (Eph. 3:14-20).

All these truths about the Trinity must be accepted by faith based on the reliability of Scripture. I have never seen God. No one has (cf. John 1:18). I have never empirically perceived God helping me in some way. I haven't heard the Spirit praying on my behalf to the Father. I have not witnessed or heard the Son serving as my advocate in the courts of heaven. God has never audibly answered any of my prayers, and God's providence is something I always seem to perceive in hindsight. Nevertheless, I believe the Trinity is there for us in all these ways and more. The world mocks us, but that's when we need to point them to the cross. We are ultimately assured of God's love and care by Christ's wounds (John 3:16; Rom. 5:6-10; 1 John 3:16).
