Worshiping the God Who Isn't

A caricature is a sketch or picture of a person in which certain striking features are exaggerated or blown out of proportion. Most caricatures are intended to be comical. If you're able, take a moment to google "celebrity caricatures." Some of them are especially brilliant, but they're all funny.

What's not amusing is when we do this with God. We blow some expectation of God or promise of God or attribute of God out of proportion, failing to see him and worship Him as He really is. We act as if this caricature of God that we've created or invented is God, and we worship that God, and when we worship that God, we are worshiping the God who isn't.

Some worship "**Trivia God.**" You're probably familiar with Trivial Pursuit. It's the classic and unending game that has delighted America for years by testing the knowledge of everyone in the household about a variety of things. "Trivia God" is neat because all he really cares about is knowledge. In fact, "Trivia God" has given us a big book, and there are all kinds of names and places and events to memorize, and all "Trivia God" really cares about is the retention of facts. Never mind being moved into action (cf. Matt. 7:24-27; Jas. 1:22-25). If I read my Bible and retain what I've read, then the Bible has served its purpose. "Trivia God" only cares about whether you know the right answers. "Trivia God" is a false god. He's not the real God.

Some worship "Genie God." These folks view God like a genie in the lamp. We have a need. We have this moment of crisis, and we get all flustered, and then we remember, "Oh, I have a lamp with a genie inside. I can rub the lamp, say a prayer, and the genie will pop out. He will grant my wish, and then he will go back into the lamp until I summon him next time." We view God as a Heavenly Butler who is always at our beck and call. "Genie God" wants you to be happy, and that pretty much sums up his existence. "Genie God" is under our control. We manage him; he doesn't manage us. We think that we can put him in our pocket and carry him around. We let him out when he is allowed to be out, especially when we want or need something from him, and we keep him in when we don't want him interfering with what we are doing. "Genie God" is not God. "Genie God" does not exist, except in people's minds.

Others worship "Cupid God." In a word, "Cupid God" is soft. Because his love, mercy, and grace are so overwhelming and powerful, he can pretty much ignore your sin and failure. In fact, when it comes to this god, words like "holy," "just," and "righteous" shouldn't be used to describe him. If you listen closely to his worshipers talk about him, you'll soon realize that this deity didn't create a place called hell.

Still others worship "**Tyrant God.**" If some people are worshiping "Cupid God"; others are worshiping the opposite: "Tyrant God." His trademark is the lightning bolt that he's poised to throw down in a moment's notice. His worshipers are fixated on the destruction of sinners because that's this god's calling card. Wrath is this god's forte, not mercy, grace, or longsuffering. He's a despot that just wants to show everyone how powerful he is. Fear, not love, is the only proper response to this god.

A. W. Tozier once observed, "What comes into our minds when we think about God is the most important thing about us." It determines everything. It certainly determines if we are true worshipers worshiping the true God. So, it is pivotal that we perceive Him correctly (Rom. 11:22). We need to be certain that the God we believe in, worship, and speak about is real and true. All of us should desire to delight in the real character of God and not in a caricature of God.


