This psalm of Moses, though it highlights many of the struggles that God's people faced, also offers many hopeful, encouraging points, as well as providing several applications that we would do well to remember. For the purposes of this final article of 2021, I would like for us to consider just three of the many great things from Psalm 90.

To begin with, the first two verses remind us that God is from everlasting to everlasting, and that He has been and always will be our dwelling place! Many love the song "This World Is Not My Home," and Moses understood that when he penned this psalm.

Next, verses 10-12 speak of the brevity and frailty of life and encourage us to make the most of our days. Verse 12 calls us "to number our days." This is a sentiment that that Paul would echo in Ephesians 5:15-17.

Finally, the last verse of the psalm reads, "Let the favor of the Lord our God be upon us, and establish the work of our hands upon us; yes, establish the work of our hands." This should absolutely be a prayer that each of us prays daily! We need God's favor. It is a tremendous blessing to know that God has promised us His favor, but it is still important to ask for it! And when we do God's will and He establishes that work, much good and much growth will come from it.

I love you all, and I am thankful for what so many of you have done to help my 2021 be a great year. Let's make 2022 even better!
