Growing Spiritually

Toddlers often remark that they want to grow up. I can recall Reese saying on one occasion, "When I'm big like you, Daddy, I will get to drive a car." [Let's all pray that Reese never gets as big as her daddy; such would be unbecoming of a lady.] I would venture to say that most people, if not all people, come to a point in childhood, whether as a toddler or teenager, when they long to grow up and enter adulthood.

Of course, our reasons for wanting to grow up are often substandard. I'll be able to drive. I'll be able to stay up as late as I want and go wherever I want whenever I want. Visions of freedom start dancing around in our noggins. We don't think about the fact that adulthood comes with various responsibilities, like working, paying bills, maintaining a house, nurturing a marriage, raising children, etc.

Nevertheless, most of us come to a point when we desire to grow up, and physical growth is automatic, if we don't starve ourselves or die first. If you were to compare Charlie Shadrick now to when he was first born, you would notice a difference. The boy's parents aren't starving him, and he isn't turning away the food. Physical growth is essentially automatic.

But what about spiritual growth? Do you desire to grow up spiritually (1 Cor. 3:1; Eph. 4:11-16)? Do you want to mature spiritually (Heb. 5:11-14)? Do you long to become more like Christ (Ga. 4:19; Col. 1:28)? How much do you think about spiritual growth and maturity? Is it a priority in your life?

While physical growth is essentially automatic, spiritual growth is intentional. Spiritual growth doesn't just happen. Besides depending on God, spiritual growth requires diligence and discipline on our part (2 Pet. 1:5-11).

In our auditorium class on Wednesday nights, I am encouraging us to grow spiritually by presenting some practical lessons along these lines. If you long to grow spiritually, then this class is for you.

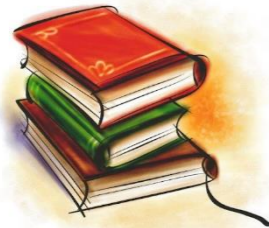

Nelly and I were squirrel hunting a couple of weeks ago, and looking at some of the nests made me think about several different things.

Obviously, squirrels build and live in nests. Not all of them are in tree limbs. They will also build nests/dens in cavities within trees, and ground squirrels live in burrows on the ground.

Birds also build nests. Whether they build their nests in bird houses, in trees, or under your carport so that your car incessantly needs to be washed, their reason for building nests is all about their eggs. They lay and incubate their eggs in the nest and proceed to raise their young there until they are able to fly.

When turkeys nest, they do it on the ground. They aren't the only birds that nest on the ground, but they are the one that does that I care the most about (spring is almost here, turkey hunters)! Hen turkeys will lay several eggs over the period of a couple of weeks, leaving only sporadically for short times after the last egg is laid. Hen turkeys incubate their eggs for about a month. Obviously, because of predators, they prefer to do this in thick, protected areas.

Human beings make nests, too. Mothers who are getting ever closer to giving birth often do what is called “nesting” as they clean, organize, and prepare for bringing their baby into their home. There's also the idea of “empty nesters,” i.e., parents whose children have grown up and left the home.

Whatever else we might say about nesting, its importance is based on a couple of things: protection/safety and preparation/success. Do we have a spiritual nest, or are we providing them for those around us? Are we all doing our part to help build a church that will provide safety to our young ones and prepare them for success spiritually? I am thankful for the “nest” that Pulaski Street and PSYG provide!
