The Empty Tomb

In December 1927, a coast guard cutter named Paulding accidentally rammed the USS S-4, an S-class submarine, off the shore of Massachusetts. Because of the frigid weather, heavy seas, and gale force winds, rescuing the crew of some 40 individuals on this submarine was virtually impossible. All forty perished; however, in the last few days of the crew's existence in this world, there was a deep-sea diver who stayed close to the hull of the sub. The deep-sea diver, at one point, could hear someone inside the sub tapping on the hull of the submarine using Morse code: "Is . . . there . . . any . . . hope?" It was a desperate question in their circumstances, but it was also profound. When death is knocking at the door, is there any hope? When death has already entered the room, is there any hope?

There are four major world religions that revolve around an individual: 1) Buddhism; 2) Islam; 3) Judaism; 4) Christianity. Of these four, only one points to an empty tomb! Those of us who are Christians can point to an empty tomb (Mark 16:1-8), and that empty tomb gives us what Peter refers to as "a living hope" (1 Pet. 1:3).

That empty tomb reminds us that our Lord and Savior is still very much alive and that He will one day come back to raise us from the dead, if we die before He returns (John 5:28-29; 1 Cor. 15:20-24). That empty tomb answers once and for all Job's question, "If a man dies, shall he live again?" (Job 14:14). That empty tomb assures us that death will not have the final word (1 Cor. 15:50-57).

The best news the world has ever heard came from a cemetery near Jerusalem. If you are in Christ, there is always hope, even in death.
