Buoying the Bereaved

After a weekend of visitations and funerals, I thought I would share some things that we can do to help, comfort, and sustain those who are mourning the loss of a loved one.

❖ **Be present and available.** There's nothing wrong with sending flowers, cards, and other gifts of sympathy, but our presence will always mean more than our presents. Those who are bereaved may forget what we sent to them, but they won't likely forget that we were there with them. Furthermore, in the wake of a loved one's passing, there are still certain expectations to meet, appointments to keep, bills to pay, food to eat, and chores to complete. Aiding the bereaved in one or more of these areas can be huge.

❖ **Be an active listener.** When conversing with those who are grieving, let them do most of the talking. Listen to their stories about their loved one. Let them tell you about the circumstances of their loved one's death. When you do speak, avoid canned condolences, Pollyanna observations, and a recitation of your own problems. Validate their feelings and emotions. Lightly push for clarification when you're not quite sure what they are trying to say. Job's comforters ultimately failed him because of their many words and bad theology (Job 16:2; 42:7). They did right by Job in the beginning when they just sat with him without saying a word to him (Job. 2:11-13).

❖ **Pray with them.** At every visit, be sure to pray with the one who is grieving. Since our God is the "God of all comfort" (2 Cor. 1:3), it would be foolish for us not to petition Him for help and comfort. And be sure to thank God for His Son who defeated sin and death to provide us with the hope of a life beyond this one where tears, death, and mourning are no more (Rev. 21:4).
