False Security

A story is told of Lieutenant George Dixon, a genteel, well-respected man in the Confederate army. In the early days of the war, his fiancée reportedly gave him a \$20 gold piece. During the battle of Shiloh, a Union minié ball, a hollow-based bullet, struck the gold coin in Dixon's trouser pocket, saving his leg and possibly his life. The coin, now dented, was to remain with him wherever he went. It became his good luck piece, and he would often be seen kneading the coin in his hand.

And where did Lt. Dixon take the coin? Onto the *CSS Hunley*, the Confederate submarine he staunchly believed could break the Union blockade. After sinking the *USS Housatonic*, the *Hunley* herself sank, taking Lt. Dixon and his crew to their deaths. In 2000, the wreckage of the *Hunley* was raised, and in 2002, a misshapen \$20 gold piece, minted in 1860, with the inscription "*Shiloh April 6, 1862 My Life Preserver G. E. D.*" was found among the wreckage.

Ultimately, Lt. Dixon's golden good luck piece could not save him. Humanity seeks and trusts in many forms of security. The only reliable and enduring source of security is God (Psalm 40, 41, 91; Heb 5:8-9; 9:12).
