## Kindling Kindness

Henry Drummond writes, "I wonder why it is that we are not all kinder than we are? How much the world needs it. How easily it is done. How instantaneously it acts. How infallibly it is remembered. How superabundantly it pays itself back." I think we can all agree that our world needs more kindness . . . a lot more. Those of us who are Christians should be leading the way in filling this world with kindness. After all, to love others as God would have us to do is to be kind to others (1 Cor. 13:4).

We've all got these general thoughts, impressions, and pictures of what kindness is, but to put it in words is difficult. I looked up "kindness" in Webster's Dictionary, and here's what I read: "the quality or state of being kind." Thanks, but no thanks, Noah.

Kindness is lending our strength when others are weak. It involves compensating for another's weakness, shortcoming, or failure by supplying resources, employing some skill or talent, or being present with encouraging words and gestures. Kindness is lifting others up rather than putting others down. It's not rude. Kindness isn't brutally frank; it's kindly honest (Eph. 4:15). And kindness is no respecter of persons. Kindness is to be displayed even when the other person is obnoxious, hateful, or ungrateful (Luke 6:35). We should choose to be kind even when others don't deserve it. There is a strong correlation in Scripture between kindness and grace (Eph. 2:7).

One of the central messages of the gospel is that God in Christ has been kind to us. The Father didn't just send us a postcard or look down on us from on high and send us good vibes. He sent his Son (John 3:16), and Jesus was kind to us in more ways than one. He "went about doing good" (Acts 10:38). "[T]hough he was rich," he "became poor, so that [we] by his poverty might become rich" (2 Cor. 8:9). He supplies us strength to compensate for our weakness (2 Cor. 12:9). In Titus 3:4-5, we find this summary of the gospel, and notice that God's kindness in Christ stands at the center: "But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit." Because God has been kind to us, we should be kind to others.

Though unproven, the following words have been attributed to a Quaker missionary named Stephen Grellet: "I shall pass through this world but once. Any good thing, therefore, that I can do, or any kindness that I can show to any human being, let me do it now. Let me not defer it or neglect it, for I shall not pass this way again." That's precisely the attitude that we should have if we are going to kindle some kindness in this world in hopes of redeeming the world. Yes, we need to have the courage of our convictions, but we need to manifest those convictions in kindness and consideration, not in the heartless, hurtful cruelties sometimes exhibited by professing Christians and often exhibited by the world.
