Living in the Future Tense

In Philippians 3, Paul essentially argues that the Judaizers were living in the past tense, trying to get the Philippian believers to go back to Moses and the Law, while genuine Christians live in the future tense, anticipating the return of their Savior: "Our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will transform our lowly body to be like his glorious body, by the power that enables him even to subject all things to himself" (vv. 20-21). For the breakdown of Philippians 3:20-21 below, I am indebted to the work of Avon Malone in his book *Press to the Prize*.

The Sure Return (Phil. 3:20b). Here's what the angels said after Jesus' ascension: "This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven" (Acts 1:11). Jesus himself said, "I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also" (John 14:3). Peter emphatically asserts, "... the day of the Lord will come" (2 Pet. 3:10). This unequivocal affirmation from Peter comes in response to scoffers who were skeptically asking, "Where's the promise of his coming?" (2 Pet. 3:3-6). In view of God's intervention in the past (2 Pet. 3:6) and in view of the empty tomb, Christians cling confidently to one great certainty: He will return. Therefore, a state of intense expectancy characterizes (or should characterize) God's children.

The Splendid Redemption (Phil. 3:21a). The total redemptive process includes our bodies (1 Cor. 6:14; 15:50-57). In Romans 8:23, Paul says that as God's children we "groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies." To the Corinthians, Paul employs a rather paradoxical term "spiritual body" to describe the Christian's resurrected and transformed body (1 Cor. 15:44). We don't know everything we would like to know about this "body," but we should be content with John to say that "what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that when he appears we shall be like him" (1 John 3:2). We rest in the assurance that because Jesus was raised (1 Thess. 1:10; 4:14), we, too, will be raised and made to conform to his glorious body (2 Cor. 4:14). As Malone says, "A body locked by limitations, fettered by frailty, pursued by pain, and doomed to die will be raised to glory and immortality" (98).

The Sufficient Resource (Phil. 3:21b). Some of the Corinthians saw insuperable difficulties connected with the resurrection of the body. In 1 Corinthians 15, Paul countered that Christ, the firstfruits, had already been raised, and this very reality serves as assurance that the harvest will be completed (1 Cor. 15:20-21). He who made both celestial and terrestrial bodies is certainly able to provide us with a "spiritual body" (1 Cor. 15:35-49). He who created all things (John 1:3; Col. 1:16ff) can readily summon the dead and fit them for eternity (John 5:28-29). Jesus is in full possession of that power. Our part is to obediently trust him and confidently await His return.

There is tremendous energy in the present power of a future hope. Because Abraham looked for a city, he was content to live in a tent (Heb. 11:13-16). Because Moses looked for the rewards of heaven, he was willing to forsake the treasures of earth (Heb. 11:24-26). Because of the "joy that was set before him" (Heb. 12:2), Jesus was willing to endure the cross. The fact that Jesus Christ is returning and will transform our bodies by the power he possesses is a powerful motivation for dedicated living and devoted service today (Phil. 3:20—4:1; 1 John 3:2-3).

Closing it out:

Hebrews 10 is full of teachings that offer hope and encouragement to followers of Christ. When the author penned this chapter, he gave us at least three different reasons to keep going.

First, we read about the better sacrifice that we have today. Under the old covenant, animal sacrifices had to be made continually due to their inability to atone fully for sin. They were merely a shadow of the things to come. In Jesus, the "true form" and atoning sacrifice, we do find the power for sins to be forgiven! It is wonderful to know that our sins are forgiven and that we no longer have to worry about offering sacrifices!

Second, we read of the confidence we can and should have when approaching the Father through prayer. Through the flesh and blood of Jesus, we can enter the holy places (vv. 19-22). Under the old covenant, the high priest was the only one able to do so and only once a year. Now, with Jesus' sacrifice having torn down the curtain of separation, we can boldly and confidently enter the holy places!

Third, we are encouraged by the Hebrews writer to stand firm. Verse 35 tells us to not throw away our confidence. Verse 36 reminds us of our need for endurance. And then verse 39 affirms that we are not those who shrink back and are destroyed. We are those who keep going! We are those who "have faith and preserve [our] souls."
