Disciple

Welcome to 2023! This past Sunday I introduced our theme for the new year: "Disciple." When Jesus called Peter and Andrew, He said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you become fishers of men" (Mark 1:17). Mark did not include this verse for the purpose of defining a disciple, but it serves as a helpful framework for understanding what it means to be a disciple. Everything the New Testament teaches about being a disciple can be categorized under three elements that are discernible in this one verse: (1) *following Jesus* ("Follow me"); (2) *being changed by Jesus* ("I will make you become"); (3) *joining Jesus' mission* ("fishers of men"). Below is the monthly breakdown of how we will explore these facets of being a disciple of Jesus:

In the New Testament, the concept of being a disciple is not an add-on to conversion; it is part of conversion. The Word of God teaches that the decision to receive the gift of salvation is also a decision to follow the path of discipleship. Are you a disciple of Jesus? If not, the best resolution you can make at the start of 2023 is to become one. If you are a disciple, my prayer is that this year will strengthen your resolve to follow Jesus every day of your life.
