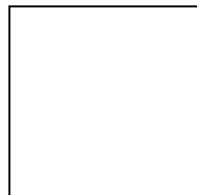

## The Continuation of Communion

In 1 Corinthians 11:23-26, Paul writes: "For I received from the Lord what I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and said, 'This is my body, which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' In the same way also he took the cup, after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.' For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes."

At the very least, we can conclude from the above passage that the Lord's Supper was something that Jesus expected to continue among His people. What was commenced by Jesus among His apostles on the night He was betrayed was to continue among His people after the establishment of the church and in every expansion of the church. But one might plausibly ask: How often is "often"? In other words, how often does Jesus expect His people to commune?

We know from 1 Corinthians 16:1-2 that the Corinthian church was assembling every first day of the week, i.e., "the Lord's Day" (Rev. 1:10). From 1 Corinthians 11:17-34, we know that the Corinthian Christians observed the Lord's Supper when they came together as a church every first day of the week (vv. 18, 20), however imperfect and messed up it may have been. In putting these two passages together, it is clear that the Lord's Supper and the Lord's Day, i.e., the first day of the week, belong together. We should not separate the two . . . ever. That's the simplest conclusion from the NT data we have. The Lord's Supper should be eaten every Lord's Day when the Lord's people assemble to worship the Lord. And if you're wondering what gives the first day of the week its theological significance, consider that the Gospels make it a point to tell us that Jesus was resurrected from the dead on the first day of the week (Matt. 28:1; Mark 16:2; Luke 24:1; John 20:1, 19).

Having noted communion's commencement and continuance, I want to use next week's article to highlight the various components of communion. As we'll see, the Lord's Supper is unquestionably a rich expression of worship.
